SA Ambulance Service (SAAS) has launched its volunteer recruitment campaign, Answer the Call and is looking for some more volunteers in your region.

Around 1200 SAAS volunteers already provide professional ambulance services to South Australians in 77 locations. This year the campaign will stretch from Hawker in the Flinders Ranges to Penola on the Limestone Coast.

Operations Manager, Bryan Petersen said the campaign is a great opportunity for locals from the Limestone Coast who would like to do more for themselves and their community by signing up with SAAS.
